Presented in association with the Culture Warriors exhibition this is a rare opportunity to meet and engage leading Indigenous Australian and North American thinkers and artists about some of the world's oldest creative cultures.

Panelists include: moderator Professor Jolene Rickard of Cornell University's Department of History of Art & Visual Studies; Culture Warriors artists Richard Bell (Kamilaroi/Kooma/Jiman/ Gurang Gurang peoples) and Gordon Hookey (Waanyi/Waanjiminjin peoples); Ryan Rice (Mohawk of Kahnawake) artist and curator at the Museum of Contemporary Native Arts, Santa Fe; and author of Everything You Know about Indians is Wrong and Associate Curator at the Smithsonian's National Museum of the American Indian Paul Chaat Smith (Comanche).
